PLINKING RANGE RULES

Rules:

- Due to the confined space of the range, shooters must remain abreast of each other while firing and maintain a minimum of 6 feet between shooters at all times.
- Hearing and eye protection is required.
- All calibers of rifles, muzzle loaders, hand guns and shotguns are authorized.
- All tracers, explosive, smoke, flares, armor piercing and incendiary ammunition are prohibited.
- .50 caliber BMG weapons and Class 3 or Full Automatic weapons ARE NOT authorized at any time.
- Minimum shooting distance is 25 yards. No targets are allowed to be placed short of the 25 yard berm.
- DO NOT walk on the berms when placing or retrieving targets.
- PROHIBITED TARGETS include glass, clays, or any objects that shatter, electronic equipment of any kind (TV, computers, etc.), propane tanks, fire extinguishers, and any solid object, metal or otherwise, that may cause ricochets.
- No shooting forward of the firing line/shooting benches.
- Walking down range shooting is strictly prohibited.
- Before anyone may go forward of the firing line, all firearms must be cleared, magazines removed, actions open, and removed from the bench. No handling of firearms when anyone is forward of the firing line.
- Vehicles are not authorized on the range except behind the firing line.
- Always point the muzzle of a firearm in a safe direction.
- Keep your finger off the trigger until ready and safe to fire
- Firearms must be unloaded until ready to shoot.
- Know how to use your firearm safely.
- Use only the correct ammunition for your firearm.
- Never use alcohol or drugs before or while shooting.
- Store firearms so they are not accessible to unauthorized persons.
- No shooting before 9:00 AM, all shooting must end before dusk.
- REMEMBER to take all targets, ammunition, spent casings and any other trash with you or dispose of it in the container provided.

Violation of these rules should be reported to the club officers or board of directors. Violators may be dismissed from the club.

These rules are reviewed annually by the range committee chairman. Any suggestions or recommendations to make our club safer should be directed to the rifle committee chairman or any member of the club management team.
